POLICY RESPONSE – SYSTEMIC CHANGES

• 17 essential systemic changes that need to be made in the following two decades in order to achieve the vision and set the key directions for long-term development of the country

- 1. Value is grounded in entrepreneurship and processes are led by innovations
- 2. Knowledge and development of skills are flexible and focused on needs
- 3. Achieving efficiency by applying new technologies and business models.
- 4. Cooperation between different stakeholders allows for better results.
- 5. Cross-sectoral cooperation that ensures involvement of all concerned parties.

- 6. Public services are designed according to the needs of beneficiaries and effectiveness/efficiency in their provision.
- 7. National support schemes are aimed at transforming the economy through the provision of unobstructed and fair transition.
- 8. The health system and activation of the population are based on promotion of a healthier way of life, risk-reduction and prevention in all age groups.
- 9. Sustainable food production systems are key for the quality of life and resilience of the country.
- 10. Social protection measures stimulate changes in the condition of the targeted social groups and support the growth of natality.
